Dear Parents, Catholic Educators, Principals, Coordinators, and Pastors,

### Re: Preparing for the Sacraments of Reconciliation, First Holy Communion and Confirmation

Preparing children to receive the sacraments of healing (Reconciliation) and initiation (Eucharist and Confirmation) is a time of great joy for parents and the communities of faith who envelop them.

As God has commissioned parents to nurture in their children the flame of baptismal grace, so it is for the mother and father of each child to choose support of school or parish catechesis as they lead their child into the life of the Church and the sacraments.

Through the grace of the sacrament of marriage, parents receive the responsibility and privilege of evangelizing their children. Parents should initiate their children at an early age into the mysteries of the faith of which they are the "first heralds" for their children. They should associate them from their tenderest years with the life of the Church. <sup>34</sup> A wholesome family life can foster interior dispositions that are a genuine preparation for a living faith and remain a support for it throughout one's life. (CCC 2225)

Celebration of sacraments is a parish event. Ongoing faith formation and preparation for sacraments is a collaboration of communities: family, Catholic school or parish educators, and parish church. We understand the roles of these communities as follows:

#### Parents:

- cooperate with the special grace of their marriage covenant to lead their children into the life of the Church and an ever more intimate relationship with God who loves them
- seek support for this vocation from their pastor, and from religious educators in church and school; parents choose which catechetical ministry will best serve their child.
- to the best of their ability, parents lead by example in seeking to understand and practice the Church's teaching on issues of faith
- must be registered with the local parish, and support the work of the church as good stewards of their gifts of time, talent and treasure
- register for celebration of sacraments with the parish, whether preparing in school or parish
- take part in all meetings, masses and events specific to sacraments preparation as directed by their pastor and their child's faith formation program
- model a Christian way-of-being in the world, active in the communal and sacramental life of the Church, celebrating Sunday Mass, and bringing Christ with them in the everyday.

#### Parish RE Coordinators and Catechists:

- recognize there are two paths for religious education Catholic school and parish catechesis each with the same source and summit Jesus Christ!
- \* support parents in nurturing the faith of their children
- \* acknowledge the contribution of Catholic schools who accommodate the sometimes varied expectations for sacraments of multiple parishes in their shared ministry

- understand supplies for school and parish catechesis are purchased under their own budgets
- when sharing school spaces, ensure that rooms are left as found, with teacher and student items untouched, and classrooms ready for morning activities the next day as prepared.

### School Principals and Teachers:

- recognize there are two paths for religious education Catholic school and parish catechesis each with the same source and summit Jesus Christ!
- remind parents reception of sacraments is a solemn rite celebrated by the church, not a school function
- support parents in nurturing the faith of their children
- teach children about the sacrament specifically nature, effect, symbolism, liturgy as found in the Catechism of the Catholic Church and supporting resources
- provide a list of students preparing for sacraments with names and home contact information to their registered parish
- receive direction for specific preparation e.g. student retreat, Christian service and inquire about dates for sacraments and associated parish meetings and activities, to ensure children are prepared in advance of these dates
- forward parish communication as requested
- understand supplies for school and parish catechesis are purchased under their own budgets
- recognize and be joyous as a school community when students have received a sacrament.

### Parish - Pastor, RE Coordinator, or Pastor's Designate:

- make inquiry to the school for a list of students preparing for sacraments in that parish
- contact all parents of children preparing for sacraments, in both school and parish catechesis, regarding requirements for reception of sacraments and meeting dates
- host preparation meetings for parents, families, sponsors, and/or children
- deliver resources to parents to support preparation at home, e.g. "We Prepare for Reconciliation", "We Share in the Eucharist"
- set the date for celebration of each sacrament (confirmation date on approval of the Bishop's Office) and communicate dates to all parents and school
- where practical, (more difficult in multi-parish schools), include school staff (teachers of 2/7 and/or principal) in organizing and celebrating the sacraments
- give any special gifts to all children
- whenever possible, ensure the church community is included in preparation and celebration of sacraments as both Christian service and spiritual renewal.

Please retain this letter as a guide for better understanding the shared roles and responsibilities in sacraments preparation. As a diocese, our goal is to nurture effective collaboration between families, religious educators, and parish communities as we illuminate for children the beauty of the Catholic faith and welcome them into the life-giving sacraments as One Body of Christ.
